Made Known [Rose Condra with Choices]

Job 29:15-17

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain.

2. Rose started her message saying, "Each number has a name. Each name has a story. Every story matters to God", when referring to the clients they have come through their doors. As a church, we see many different faces and each have a name and a story that matters to God. What are some ways we can be intentional with learning the stories of those around us?
 - b. How does knowing someone's story help with helping Jesus' name to be made known in their lives?

3. Rose shared an incredible story describing of the time where a single mom had heard the gospel from them over 12 times. One of their mentors who was working with her knew she needed to share with the young mother the gospel "one more time" and was able to lead this woman to Christ. Many of us may have similar stories of sharing the gospel to no avail. What hope did this story give you? How as a church can we learn from it?

Challenge for the Church: In reading Job 29:15-17, it is a powerful description of the role of the church, and who we are to be to those who are lost and hurting, and easily a victim to the world around them. Share some of your thoughts on this passage.

- b. What are some ways that we as a home group and church can help those who are lost and hurting in the world we live in?

- c. Choices and their team continue to focus on one name and one story as they serve our community. What is one name, one story we can be praying for as a home group?

Closing in prayer: Close in prayer this week as a group asking for the Holy Spirit to lead us to share our story and the gospel message “one more time”.
